Modern Language Association Format (MLA)

Basic Requirements for Morrow House Bibliographies

- Author, Title, Publisher, Copyright Date. <URL if Internet source>
- Include page numbers for periodicals.
- Double-space the entire list. Do not add extra spaces between individual entries.
- Tab or indent the second line of each entry 5 spaces.
- Alphabetize list by author (Use title or corporation name if there is no author).
